INCOMING MOBILITY

Pre – Departure

- Apply for a visa and book your tickets in advance
- Buy a Health Insurance
- Get a <u>health certificate</u> from an authorized medical practitioner
- Documents checklist (in original for travel to India):
 - Passport & Visa
 - Citizenship ID
 - Travel Tickets
 - Health Certificates/Vaccination Certificates including COVID-19 double vaccination certificates and valid RT-PCR Negative report (72 Hours before travel)
 - Health insurance.
 - Other official documentation (e. g Offer Letter/Invitation from IIT Indore)
- Other necessary items checklist:
 - Prescription medicine (If any)
 - Money in Indian Currency
 - Other required necessary items required during your stay in India.
- Keep multiple copies of important documents in a safe place separate from original documents
- Save your certificates on electronic online drives for e.g., Google Drive, Digi locker, etc.
- Share your travel plans well in advance with our IR office on interfice@iiti.ac.in .
- Get your accommodation (in IIT Campus) booked well in advance.
- Get your transportation (pick up from Airport) booked at IIT Indore and do confirm the receipt of contact details of the CAB driver with IR office.
- Share your details for the creation of ID Card. Download the format from our website under international students' section.
- Plan to get the sim connection issued at the airport itself after arriving in India.

After arrival on IITI Campus

- Visit International Relations Office, Abhinandan Bhavan, 7th Floor, West Wing, IIT Campus to get FRRO registration done within 24 hours of your arrival. You are also requested to collect the information on booked accommodation.
- Visit Academic Office, Abhinandan Bhavan, 1st Floor, East Wing, and IIT Campus to complete registration process. Carry all original documents mentioned in document checklist. Also, ensure opening of your Indian Bank Account and issuance of Indian SIM card. If not done within 2 days, inform International Relations Office.
- You can contact your student mentor (assigned with you from Student Affairs) / office of International Relations in case of any emergency or any need/concern.

• You are allowed to avail all the facilities available for other students on the IIT Campus.

Facilities at IIT Indore



Accommodation: The Institute has 05 hostels which provide students with a homely environment, overseen by a dedicated and professional housekeeping team. Each hostel has 98 units with a capacity of accommodating a total of 490 students. Each unit has five bedrooms with single occupancy for each student. It also has a furnished living area, common kitchen, two toilets, and two washrooms. You will be given multiple options to make your stay more comfortable, you can choose any one category

"a)" applicable for accommodation (JC Bose) semi furnished and the option of cooking facility. Electricity bills shall be paid separately by the student.

"b)" applicable for Hall of Residence along with basic amenities. No cooking facility.

"c)" applicable for facilities to be provided at par with Indian students. No cooking facility.

**You will be provided with basic amenities like mattress, pillows, bedsheet, blanket, curtains, bucket, mug, doormat, soap case, dustbin, hook rope, and laundry bag.

IIT Indore ensures that students from different states, languages and different departments are allotted in a unit to promote interdisciplinary approach in study and research and for internationalization.

Meals: Meals can be a little challenge. Everyone has different eating habits, likes, and dislikes. Plus, you need to give yourself and your stomach time to get used to the new and spicy food you will be eating in India. There are plenty of cuisines available in veg & nonveg meals. Students are served healthy meals wherein the menu is decided by the dining committee which includes student representatives as well and is updated regularly. Flexible options are available to pay as you eat i.e., Meal wise (Breakfast/ Lunch/ Hi-Tea/ Dinner), Day, Monthly and Semester. The payment is done through Smart Card Facility and is totally cashless. Other than regular dining services, there are several kiosks viz. Shiru Café, Bakeology, Noor's Kitchen, Aladeen's Café, Daily Needs, My Village Coffee Shop, Sainath Juice Point, Amul Shop which serve delicacies round the clock.

Extra-Curricular activities: IITI houses many extra-curricular activity centers where you can advance your hobbies or develop new ones. Yoga & Fitness Club, Photography, Music, Chess, and Drama clubs are only a few amongst many clubs. You can contact various club coordinators to join these clubs. Health Center: We have a Health Center on campus that provides emergency and primary healthcare facilities to the campus residents.

La Fresco Store: The store works under the aegis of the IITI Co-operative Society and caters to the grocery needs of the campus residents. It also fulfills the petty stationery needs of the students. The store tries to fulfill the daily needs of the campus residents at a reasonable price so that they don't have to go outside for small purchases.

Safety and Hygiene: While in India, safety and hygiene might be a concern for you. However, with some care and little precaution, you can enjoy a perfectly healthy stay in the country.

Banking and Postal Services: The institute campus has a branch of Canara Bank with ATM facility and a post office. ATM facility of SBI and HDFC are also available for cash transaction.

Counseling Service: The IR office will arrange a visit to the IITI Counseling Service. The Counseling Service ensures that IITI is not just an institute, but a home away from home for you. An Orientation Programme for the freshers is arranged at the very beginning of the session to acquaint them with the academic activities, facilities, services, personnel, rules, and regulations of the Institute. Don'ts


- Avoid the lip-smacking Indian street food on regular basis. Avoid drinking tap water and carry bottled water instead.

- Outside campus, do not carry valuables, especially important documents (ex. Passport) in your wallet.
- Do not leave the campus without intimation to your student mentor, supervisor, and International Relations Office.
- Do not enter the restricted areas/surroundings (stray/wild animal may harm).
- Don't be afraid to speak in English. Learning language takes time & practice, and they can help you improve.
- Do not spend all your time in your room (using technology), come out and explore new things.
